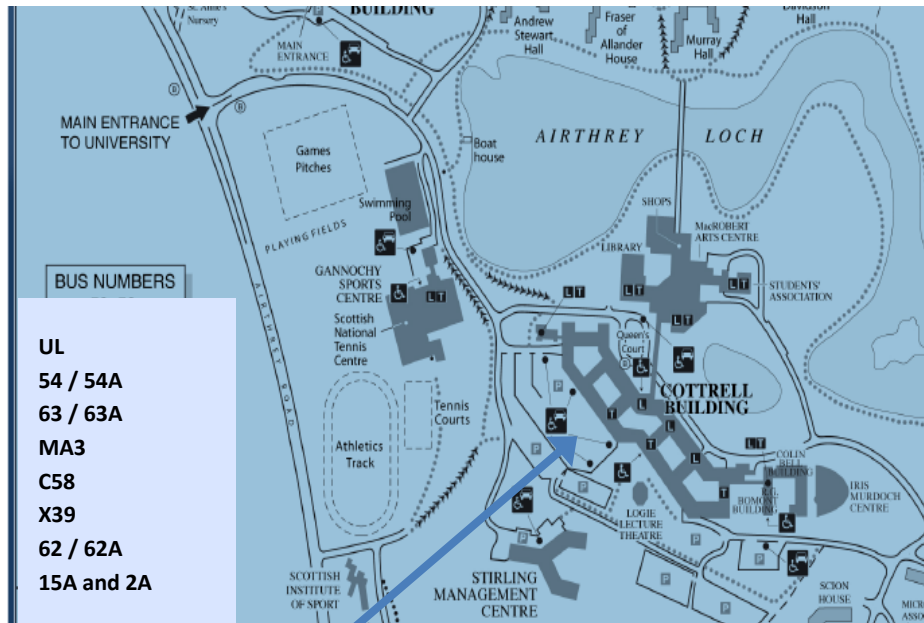


What is the Conference about?

This year, *FNH* is linking with the *Friends of the Ochils* in presenting a conference in celebration not only of the Ochil Hills but also the *Friends of the Ochils* on their 25th anniversary of the founding of the charity. The Ochils are a distinctive landmark in both the Forth Valley and Strathearn, signalling 'home' as they come into view. They stand apart from the Highlands, geologically and historically, an upland landscape that is more intimate than the mountains to north and west, a special place. The conference will explore what makes them special, from aspects of their historical evolution, how they continue to be used, to how they might best be used and managed in the 21st century.

Where is the conference held?
